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Lego means “Play well.”

2 important reminders:

There is only one true foundation worth building on.
Be careful how you build on that foundation.

To be positionally “in Christ” means that Jesus is our foundation.
We can be positionally “in Christ” but choose not to live up to
what we are “in Christ”.

How we choose to live as a Christian will never affect our position
“in Christ”.

The flesh is crucified, and yet we must guard against it by choosing to walk by the Spirit.

You don’t need to be smart to digest solid food. You just need to be humble.

The one true Foundation: Verse 10-11

All buildings rest on a foundation.

A building must have mutual dependency and integration of all components used to build the structure.

So, how are you building? Simply check your ATTITUDES,
BEHAVIORS, BELIEFS, AND MOTIVES.

Why is this important? Because we all, are God’s Temple.

God wants to be on display in your life.

You have no need to build your lives with cheap materials because you are Christ’s.
